Bold and or harsh statements? Yup. Are they true? Possibly, at least they are for me.

I know there are many different avenues or attributes that I can follow down the rabbit hole on in this scenario, but I want to focus on just one aspect: Faith!

Do we stick to the same routine in our faith lives? Go to Mass for 1 hour on the weekend and then not do anything more? Is Adoration in your schedule? Is your Knights rosary on your dresser, carried only occasionally and prayed seldom? Do you set aside time to talk to God, friend to friend?

We need to be able look at ourselves and make sure we can answer "Yes, I can" before we can say "Yes, the Knights can." So how do we do this?

In the Faith in Action section of Faith we have a tool to help us answer some of these questions. The Spiritual Reflection Program is an opportunity for us as Brother to come together for prayer and reflection as a fraternity. A day of reflection or a weekend retreat are the items to plan for this endeavor.

I have been attending retreats since I was in junior high. Admittedly the retreats in high school were more of a way to get to know girls outside of my small school back in Nebraska. As I continued to gain in years of age, I came to appreciate the retreats for what they are for; growing in my faith.

You will work with your Chaplin or Parish Priest to facilitate the reflection and or retreat. I would suggest that you focus primarily (at least the first one) on your council members. Maybe a book review such as Parish Priest; the book about Father McGivney and his brief life. Maybe a reflection of a book/chapter of the Bible. There are, of course, reporting forms that will need to be completed and sent in to Supreme to receive credit for the Program.

A day of reflection or attending a retreat will draw us closer to God and also provide the confidence to be able to say, "Yes Father, I can." When we answer yes to this, we can then answer the other question "Yes the Knights can." Let's do this!

Insurance Update

2019 October Council Meeting Message

The theme for October is "Real Life Stories."

A field agent like me who is lucky enough to be doing this great work for even a few years, undoubtedly has a personal story of the chaos and disorder that a devastated family stares at when there is a sudden loss. If our goal is to protect Catholic families from the near devastation that our Venerable founder faced, then I have to tell the story of how I can help my brother knights. The process of making sure one has adequate protection for the family is not painful; in fact since we are brother knights serving brother knights, it is often a time of not only helping to protect all that is important to a family, but also a shared experience that leads to an abiding friendship.

There are two stories I'd like to relate.

The first is about a young boy named Julius. When Julius was 7 years old his mother, Irene, who was 37, died of cancer. His father, Norman, had two teenage girls along with 7 year old Julius to support and raise. The family was forced to rely on the help and generosity of friends and relatives because Irene died without life insurance. Norman had a three hour commute to his job, but always supported his children's activities. Julius excelled at sports, especially football and his dad spent what little free time he had fostering Julius and his talent. Julius later admitted that he "was handed a life lesson early, growing up with one parent. It wasn't the easiest life—my dad sacrificed a lot."

Fast forward to Julius some 30 years later and he is married, has a wife and two children. He's done quite well for himself both professionally and financially. He has had a distinguished career and he has a considerable amount of life insurance to protect his family. Julius understands protection quite well after the early life he experienced. He understands the hardships of a family that loses a parent and what the children must go through. In his professional life he enjoyed considerable success because of those that protected him. For 13 years he was protected in his career. You see that protection for Julius came in the form of 300 pound offensive linemen...nobody called him Julius. His nickname was "Boomer"...Boomer Esiason—a four time Pro Bowler, an NFL Most Valuable Player and a Walter Peyton NFL Man of the Year. Most importantly, a husband to Cheryl and a father to Sydney and Gunnar.

"Life happens at the most unexpected of times, and life insurance is about protecting the future and the people you love," Boomer says. "Remember, if something happens and you haven't done the planning, the people you leave behind will feel the brunt of your mistakes." That story comes from LifeHappens.org.

The other story is not similar at all. It's about a member of the Knights of Columbus. He passed away recently and like in Boomer's family, left behind a spouse and several young children. There were no whispered worries at the funeral home. There was no GoFundMe page to raise money. There is no concern that the children will not go to college or that the wedding he promised his daughter will not take place. No, their home and future are secure. Who was that knight? I don't know; you don't hear about those men. Because the council didn't have to have a spaghetti dinner or pass the hat. But I assure you he was out there. But you'll never know it... because he planned.

Let's sit down and do some planning and put your mind at ease.

VOCATIONS



"Monthly Challenge from the Supreme Chaplain"

October 2019

"For everyone who exalts himself will be humbled, and the one who humbles himself will be exalted." (Gospel for Oct. 27, Lk 18:14)

We live in the age of the selfie, in what the writer David Brooks has called the culture of "the Big Me." Such a culture constantly urges us to "exalt" ourselves, but as Christians we need to be radically different by striving for humility. This means coming to terms with our pride, our desire for "likes," approval and recognition. As Mother Teresa put it, "It is in being humble that our love becomes real, devoted and ardent." Surrounded by the message to exalt ourselves, may we instead seek to humble ourselves and demonstrate real love to others.

Challenge by Supreme Chaplain Archbishop William E. Lori:

This month, I challenge you to kneel before a crucifix each morning and ask Christ to give you the gift of humility. I also challenge you, in this month dedicated to the Blessed Virgin Mary, to pray the rosary (either as a council through the Faith in Action Rosary program or as an individual) for an increase in humility.

Questions for Reflection:

What are some ways you can grow in humility? How can you strengthen your resistance to the lure of others' praise and the sting of their criticism? Did the act of humbling yourself before Christ on the cross teach you anything about how to be humble?

SPIRITUAL REFLECTION

A Higher Purpose

Create annual opportunities for prayer and reflection as a fraternity. Under the guidance of their chaplain, Knights of Columbus councils can attend a retreat or day of reflection together or perhaps organize their own event for men of their parish. Council participation in Spiritual Reflection is required to qualify for Columbian Award.

Overview

Many Catholic young people can attest that religious retreats are radically rejuvenating spiritual events that often leave a lasting impact on participants' relationship to their faith. Yet, so often, retreats seem only to be offered to students and youth. Working with their pastors, Knights of Columbus councils can hold low-cost retreats of their own. These events might be held for council members or men of the parish – or may be open to entire families. If councils are unable to organize these events themselves, they could go as a group and attend a retreat in their area to satisfy the requirement. Additionally, councils are strongly encouraged to consider visiting The Saint John Paul II National Shrine in Washington, D.C. as part of this program.

Required Program

A council must conduct this required program in the Faith category to be eligible to receive the Columbian Award.


