The Holy Family is the name given to the family of Jesus; Mary and Joseph. Devotion to the Holy Family is one that naturally grows out of love for Jesus and His family. This devotion grew in popularity in the 17<sup>th</sup> century and is still popular today with many religious congregations being founded under this title. The Holy Family is also being portrayed in popular art as well during that period. Several Popes including Pope Benedict XV and Pope Leo XIII promotes the feast as a way to counter the breakdown of the family unit. Today the Catholic Churches celebrate the feast on Sunday between Christmas and New Years.

The Feast of the Holy Family is not only about the Holy Family, but also about our own family. The main purpose of the Feast is to present a model for all Christian families. Our family life becomes holy when we live the life of the Church within our homes; this is called the domestic Church. St. John Chrysostom urges all Christians to make each home a family church and in doing so this sanctifies the family unit. Ways to do this is by reading scripture regularly, praying daily and attending Mass on Sundays and Holy days of Obligation, going to confession frequently, all done as a family unit.

We should also take this time to reflect on the values and the sanctity of our own family unit and to evaluate our family life. This is also a good time to evaluate our family within our culture, neighborhood and communities.

## "Monthly Challenge from the Supreme Chaplain"

#### January 2020

And behold, the star that they had seen at its rising preceded them, until it came and stopped over the place where the child was. They were overjoyed at seeing the star, and on entering the house they saw the child with Mary his mother. They prostrated themselves and did him homage. (Gospel for Jan. 5, Mt 2:9-12)

Whenever I meet a refugee, immigrant or traveler, I am reminded of things I take for granted. Those who come great distances to find something often draw our attention to the blessings we enjoy. Most of us are fortunate to have Jesus nearby, truly present in the tabernacle of our local church, but we take his close presence for granted all too easily. The Wise Men embarked on a difficult journey to encounter Jesus, but a five-minute drive can seem too far for us. May our daily familiarity with Jesus never result in indifference. May we instead, like the Wise Men, enter the Lord's house to do him homage.

#### Challenge by Supreme Chaplain Archbishop William E. Lori:

This month, I challenge you to take to heart the example of the Wise Men and go out of your way occasionally to visit the Blessed Sacrament in a local church. Second, I challenge you to participate in the Faith in Action March for Life or Novena for Life programs or to personally support a local pro-life initiative.

#### **Questions for Reflection:**

What daily opportunities do you have to encounter Christ? Because gratitude counters our tendency to take things for granted, how can you demonstrate daily gratitude in your life? Why is it important to visit Christ in the Blessed Sacrament, and have you benefited from this experience?

#### **A Higher Purpose**

#### Overview

The Helping Hands program is designed to recognize the important work many councils already do to care for the most disadvantaged members of our communities – the homeless, the addicted, the elderly who may feel isolated and abandoned, and many others. Through this program, councils will aid the needy through the activities they feel best suit their community, such as serving at or running a soup kitchen, repairing the facilities of a local service organization or something entirely unique. The requirements for this program are very broad in order to allow councils to serve their community in whatever way is most needed.

#### **Required Program**

A council must conduct this required program in the Community category to be eligible to receive the Columbian Award.





## Prayer for the Canonization of Father Michael J. McGivney

Tod, our Father, protector of the poor and defender of the widow and orphan, you called your priest, Father Michael J. McGivney, to be an apostle of Christian family life and to lead the young to the generous service of their neighbor.
