From Your State Chaplain

The Transfiguration is one of our great Church Feasts, and it has special meaning for me. It is a great gift that God has given us. Peter, James and John received that gift for us. They had the opportunity to see Jesus in his glorified state for a brief time while they were together with him on earth. It is a preview of what we can become if we keep the faith as dedicated disciples of Jesus Christ. I had a life changing experience on August fifth and sixth. My dad, Fr Pat Shea, who many of you may know, for those of you who do not know him; he entered the seminary after my mom died and was ordained at the age of sixty-eight. At his funeral liturgy Fr. Mike Carr reminisced about dad's ordination day saying that he was thinking "Are we out of our minds, he won't have any time to minister at his advanced age, and he served as pastor here at St. Leo's for 20 years." To no one's surprise it took an ambulance to get him away from the parish at the tender age of eighty -nine. He had a bad fall that caused paralysis. After two successful surgeries there was an unfortunate malfunction of his feeding tube on April fifth, and he had to be taken back to the ICU. Because of this, that night I prayed intensely on the vigil of the Feast of the Transfiguration of the Lord. It helped me move forward the next day and act with courage and confidence as I was challenged with the difficult decisions that needed to be made about how we should move forward with his ongoing treatment: I was transformed. It was not a transfiguration like the one Jesus had on the mountain that day, but it was great in my life. I have to keep transforming. When you look at the example of Peter on the mount, he goes out and asks the Lord if it would be okay for him to build three tents, one for Elijah, one for Moses, and one for the Lord. We can only imagine the human reaction of excitement and awe that he was feeling. The joy that he was experiencing must have been overwhelming. In that joy though he is showing that he doesn't really understand who Jesus is. He is happy because he thinks that his teacher is as important as Moses and Elijah. He knew that Jesus was important, but apparently, he was still grossly underestimating Him. He clearly has not yet realized the immensity of the power of Jesus. However, the father declared from the cloud that Jesus is his Son. We hear of this experience that St Peter had in our second reading today as he tells us to be attentive to the words of the Father that came down from heaven on that wonderful day. Peter came to understand more and more the power of Jesus and what it can mean for his life as well as for all of our lives. Jesus tells them on the way back from this experience not to tell anyone yet because they are not ready to understand. People need to slowly come to know Jesus. We all need small transformations in our lives to accomplish this, lots of them, so that we can become like Jesus!



Matt Mead to serve as his wildlife policy advisor. During his career Ryder served as the chair for the Pacific Flyway Council and Yellowstone Ecosystem Grizzly Bear Committee. Ryder has written approximately 190 technical reports, 20 peer-review publications and one book.




