On Monday, November 6, Supreme Knight Patrick Kelly celebrated the donation of <u>one million coats</u> through the Knights' *Coats for Kids* program, with the distribution of nearly 1,000 new coats to children in need in five Denver, CO Catholic schools. In recognition of the historic milestone, Supreme Knight Kelly also announced the donation of \$10,000 on behalf of the Knights of Columbus to each school, for a total of \$50,000.




