This reprimand is an important part of their commission. They needed to be aware of their own slowness to believe as they went out to proclaim the Gospel. They are not ready to go out on their on without the presence of God with them, nor will they ever be. These are very important things for us as well. We share in the same commissioning and indwelling of the Holy Spirit through our baptism and the Apostolic Succession of our Church. It is a call to be understanding of those who are slow to believe. We are all slow to believe in our own ways. We need to be consistent, patient and aware of the Holy Spirit as we live out our call to discipleship. So, as you go out as Knights and Ladies and Daughters of Knights please remember these lessons and allow the Holy Spirit to fill you so that you can be the great disciple that God is calling you to be.



DISABILITY INCOME INSURANCE

What is it?

Disability income insurance helps replace lost income when you are unable to work due to a disability resulting from an illness or accident.


Monthly Benefit

Elimination Period


